Through the years many generous partners, who have a heart for the gospel and a willingness to do what they can to share it throughout the world, have joined together with us for this mission. You are commended for your help!

After all these years, advancing the gospel is still at the core of all we do. We sometimes adjust our methods or add programs, but we remain true to our founding purpose — to advance the gospel throughout the world. TOGETHER IN THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE

The Road may be Difficult but Together We Persevere

Imagine being away from your home, around the other side of the globe, and getting sick. In fact, one of Gospelink's Field Directors found himself in that exact situation. *"Contracting the COVID-19 virus reminds me of the early missionaries who packed their belongings in caskets and set sail for the continent of Africa. They realized that going to Africa almost always ended in death. These early missionaries had such a heart for the lost in Africa they cried out 'though thousands of us die, please send more!'"*

This same heart cry was in the founder of Gospelink when he came to Africa for the sake of the gospel. He slept in tents on untouched Zambian soil and even contracted malaria more than once, yet cried out *"Send more!"* Through the last 23 years, many have come alongside Gospelink with prayers and financial help. Hundreds have literally touched this continent with us by traveling to Africa to share the gospel. Thank You!

This same spirit, fueled by those early missionaries, remains all over the African continent. Not only does Gospelink partner with almost 1,000 National Pastors in eight African countries, right now Gospelink is moving into the northeastern part of Mozambique to reach refugees and Islamic communities. This new Church Planting Initiative strategically provides resources so the gospel can be shared among Muslim

communities and in areas where the name of Jesus has never been spoken. Though these situations are dangerous and identities must remain hidden, these church planters also are crying out, *"Please send more!"* One church planter uses a boat with a sail and two rudders to go up and down the coast to minister. In his last report he was blown out into the ocean because he did not have a motor to power his boat. But he cried out, *"Though I be blown out into the ocean and fear for my life, please send more laborers."*

In the neighboring country of Zimbabwe, dozens of preachers are enabled to do ministry more effectively through their partnership with Gospelink. One such pastor had a thriving church in Bulawayo where he had running water, electricity, and comfortable living. This pastor left the comforts of this church and relocated

to a very rural area without any of these comforts. He also cries out, *"Though my living conditions are very harsh, please send more church planters."*

No matter which aspect of ministry has drawn you to partner together with us, the result has been countless hours of gospel ministry, thousands of churches being planted, and an untold number of souls brought into God's kingdom. Because of you, over 1200 National Pastors are assisted so they can focus on evangelism, discipleship, and church planting.

In the words of one of Gospelink's Field Directors, *"Contracting COVID has probably been the best thing my Lord has done for me in a long time. Now I can cry out with a different voice, thank you for sending me out and all of my fellow laborers. We love you and thank you for your support!"*



AGAINST ALL ODDS

Serving the Lord in Difficult & Dangerous Times

How do you serve the Lord in impossible circumstances? In the Bible, there are many people that lived for Him in the midst of great difficulty. Think about Noah, Abraham, Joseph, Ruth, Esther, or Rahab. A modern-day example of this is found in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) where Gospelink supports over 100 families serving the Lord against impossible odds. DRC is a nation of 88 million people (about twice the population of California) who live in a vast nation of dirt roads, little electricity, over 100 active rebel groups, and the largest UN peace keeping army in the world.

This is exactly where Pastor Isidore lives! He was a former Congolese soldier who killed dozens of people before coming to Christ and finding peace and forgiveness in Him. He was trained for the ministry under the leadership of National Director, Athanase Habimana. Now, Pastor Isidore is a Gospelink missionary and he takes the light of the gospel into the darkness! Often, he is gone for weeks to share the gospel in remote villages, military camps and rebel camps. On a recent evangelism trip, he discovered that six of his seven children had become so sick that three of them were hospitalized for treatment and

one of them almost died. The funds he received from his sponsors in the USA helped them to recover and live yet another day. Last year he took the Good News to Kibumba and Nyanza villages and also to Rumangabo military camp. In this camp, Pastor Isidore read from 1 Corinthians 3:16 and shared how God created our bodies to be a temple where His Spirit can live. He also explained how many of us use our bodies to do evil and that we do not allow God to live within us. From Romans 6:23 he shared that the wages of sin is death, but faith in Jesus Christ provides everlasting life! These soldiers listened with

great intensity to the man of God as he explained what his former life was like and what his life is like now. Through his testimony and the reading of God's Word, 50 soldiers in Rumangabo camp received Christ in 2020. Now, Pastor Isidore has baptized 40 of them and they are growing and becoming disciples who will make more disciples in the months and years to come.

God is still changing lives and authoring His story through exceedingly difficult circumstances in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Would you pray for our native missionary families serving the Lord in this far away nation?



RWANDA STRUGGLES THROUGH SHUT DOWNS

The Gospel Continues On

Rwanda, though small in size, has made some amazing impacts in the world since 1994 when thousands died in the 100-day genocide. Pastor Ephrem is a Gospelink missionary in the southern hills of this beautiful nation filled with coffee, tea, and banana farms. Though he lived through those painful days in 1994, today his life is one of joy and thanksgiving! He lives in a remote village on a dirt road, but there the Holy Spirit is alive and well and lives are being transformed by the gospel.

The COVID-19 pandemic of the last year reached even into his small village in the vast jungles of Rwanda. There he saw his own family and many of his church attenders suffer through schools being closed and even in his own church which was closed for many months. However, the gospel cannot be shut down and even amid the coronavirus he saw lives saved and transformed! One such family was the Nzahumunywura family. Pastor Ephrem returned to their home four separate times and on the last

visit, this family of three all put their faith in Jesus Christ for salvation! Paul, Annociata and Iranzi all have their names in the Lamb's Book of Life mentioned in Revelation. Paul lived all his life as a witch doctor and collected money from people in exchange for amulets, potions, curses and blessings. Though he had much money, he had no peace. But today he has peace that is beyond riches and Pastor Ephrem is training him in the Scriptures so that he may tell the Good News to others in the hills of Rwanda.

A Muslim Meets Jesus

Pastor Jules, one of Gospelink's supported African pastors, was visiting a nearby village with some of the students from the missionary school. For several days they went door-to-door sharing the gospel and met a man named Sumahili Omari. Sumahili was a Muslim, but his wife was a Christian. When Pastor Jules asked him if he could share the Word of God with him, Sumahili replied that he was a Muslim. In fact, he said that his grandparents, parents, and all of his family were Muslim. He added that,

"I know Jesus, He is not God, but a prophet sent by God like Muhammad. He has done many good things to people. That is all!"

The pastor started sharing with him who Jesus really is, what His main mission on earth was, and the reason why He had to die on the cross. After hearing his explanation, Sumahili was convicted of his sin and believed in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. This brought great joy to his wife. In those three days, a total of 48 people from that village were won to Christ.



AMBASSADOR INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY UPDATE

Even in a Year Like 2020

The Lord has done some amazing things for Ambassador International University (AIU), even in a year like 2020! Many needs were graciously provided as God has poured out His blessing on the university! Here are some highlights:

The Salama Stove building was built. Previously, villagers would cook over wood in their houses as smoke rose through the thatched roof. Now, AIU constructs the Salama stoves for cooking and heating water while venting exhaust outside of the home. They provide a source of income for the local villagers who are learning to construct them.

The Hammer Mill was constructed and is used to grind corn into a staple food for the campus and the community.

Students completed their academic year, many isolated at their homes, using the distance learning curriculum. Thirty electronic notepads were purchased to help the students study remotely from their homes. The seniors were able to graduate on time and COVID-19 did not stop the university from achieving its mission and purpose in providing theological training for the students.

A new solar system was constructed at the clinic which provides sun generated power around the clock.

Six housing units were constructed for medical personnel who will live on campus and work at the clinic.

The Master of Theology Program was launched using a distance learning format. There are ten students working diligently in the program, including one in the USA.

The Dual Enrollment program was initiated for high school students in the USA enabling them to take courses for both high school and college credit. Already 50 colleges and universities have agreed to accept some of these courses for full college credit. (See back panel for more info.)

A daycare facility has been constructed for the staff children. It includes two large and colorful classrooms, two bathrooms, and a play yard complete with swings, slides, rock climbing wall, rope climbing, and more. The little tykes will be thrilled to begin the new year in their innovative classroom.

The mission of AIU has faithfully continued through all the pitfalls of 2020. All praise to the Lord for providing during such an unprecedented year. The time is short, and opportunities to share the gospel to those who need to hear are vast. To anyone who has contributed financially or through prayer, thank you.




Located in Kazemba, Zambia, on the campus of AIU, the Center provides daily medical care for the university students and staff, as well as those living in the nearby communities.

Pastor Samweli is a small man in height, but in the eyes of God he is a giant! Why? Because this Gospelink pastor has led thousands to Christ and has helped to start many churches in Tanzania. In the complex year of 2020, he led over 120 people to trust Christ as Savior!

In the village of Kibaha Kwa Mathias a new church has been planted. One of the villagers transformed by the gospel was Masumbuko.

Before hearing about Christ, he was a thief and often was beaten in return. The scars on his body bring reminders of a life lived without Christ. He was tired of his own life and wanted to change but wondered how anyone would trust him again. About that time, Pastor Samweli knocked on his door and shared the unconditional love of Jesus. He repented and put his faith in Christ! Now he is attending discipleship classes and plans to be baptized.



HARVEST HOPE HOME UPDATE

Hiccups & Hindrances

In the west we refer to obstacles as bothers, setbacks, and trials. In Africa a softer, less abrasive term is applied — hiccups.

As the world coughed, fretted, and shut down due to COVID-19, Harvest Hope Home hiccuped. The Malawi government followed the lead of other nations and tried to prevent the spread of the pandemic. Schools endured the most uncertainty, and Harvest Hope Primary school with its 120 pupils—50 of them attending from the surrounding villages — was closed...then opened... then closed again...then opened, then closed. Not to see their children fall behind, the mothers and fathers organized a schedule for morning studies. The children were giddy and excited with the new format at first, but of course academics are academics, and the routine soon became normal. These dear parents must be applauded for their extra impetus and effort to train these children during uncertain times.

The solar powered water pumps which were installed this past year

are paying dividends with gravity fed irrigation. The normal once-a-year harvest that comes with the rainy season is now supplemented with gardens growing collards, mustard greens, tomatoes, and okra every single month!

As the ministry influences the surrounding communities, we do not forget that gardens, crops, irrigation systems, and education are all part of a process of forming lives and disciplining them. The orphans adopted into Harvest Hope Home in 2012 are becoming young men and ladies, and we are looking to the Holy Spirit for an eternal harvest. Though not yet realized, we catch glimpses in their lives and character. In 2020, Rahim, a ten-year-old, announced that he no longer wanted a Muslim name. He declared that his new name was “Owen,” and though no one knows where he heard such a title, it evidenced that he wanted to change his identity to that of a Christ follower! Pray that our Lord continues His hand of harvest at Harvest Hope Home.

A LOVE STORY

But Not A Romance

From Shakespeare to Spielberg, romance sells! Love does more than that. One of Gospelink’s Field Directors, recounts the story...

I met Nikolai Zholovan in 2003. The images of the Ukrainian city of Zaporozhne impressed my mind like the debut of a play. It was indeed my first time to visit Ukraine, and the opening scene, Act 1 as it were for Gospelink, occurred in a small church basement as Pavel Petrovich introduced us to a dozen national preachers. These evangelical men were time-tested followers of Christ though most were veterans of Communist persecutions. Their expressions were subdued and guarded; the Soviet had taught everyone to be stoic. These preachers were men of the Word, but they bought their rye bread with money made by hands rough from laying bricks, driving trucks, and mechanical repairs.

Anatoly Lalenko owned not a white tooth—they were all brass. Alexander Isaiev spoke little, gaining respect from silence and age rather than wit and verbosity. Nikolai Zholovan showed no airs of arrogance nor ecstasy of anticipation. He sat with his comrades, calm and listening. We explained our desire to aid them in the spread of the gospel in their country and stated that God had many in America who desired to help them reach their people. These men were already working for the Lord, they were not dependent on funds from abroad to serve the Lord of the harvest, but if the Lord was indeed opening such a door, they

would thank Him for it!

I met Judy in 2003 as well—also in a church building. This building was situated in northern Virginia, within potential walking distance of our nation’s capital. The padded pews and air conditioning surely lay in contrast to that of the church in Zaporozhne. On my person I carried profiles of our recently approved Ukrainian national preachers. After repeating our Lord’s cry for laborers in His harvest and our great privilege to be partakers in Jesus’ Great Commission, I talked to individuals about sponsoring a national preacher. Judy read Nikolai’s testimony, then told me that she wanted to be his sponsor.

Though not romantic, the story of Nikolai and Judy is a true love story. The object of their love is the Lord Jesus. Judy gives money and reads Nikolai’s letters simply because they both love Jesus. Nikolai works hard and though he has aged since 2003, he continues to teach Bible studies in the villages and help with children’s camps in the summer. His endeavors are not executed to impress an American lady; he loves Jesus. Judy has never visited Zaporozhne, but she has photos of those touched through their joined ministry. Judy writes to Nikolai and in turn reads his quarterly reports. She prays for his labors. She continues to be his sole supporter. God must have envisioned such a relationship when he commanded the Philippians to “*be ye like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord.*”

TOGETHER IN THE NORTHERN HEMISPHERE

The Lord of the Harvest has His People Spreading the Gospel

Fifty years ago the vast expanse of the USSR was infamous and renowned for its walls that kept people in! The limitations of personal freedom were accompanied by an exclusion of the knowledge of God the antichrists claimed did not exist. Today that God can say that the Union of Soviets no longer exists. The walls are down, but men's hearts do not seek God. Nonetheless, throughout Eastern Europe and Central Asia — places once subservient to Moscow — the Lord of the harvest has His people spreading the gospel.

These harvest workers in Ukraine are not blessed with an infrastructure which

readily supplies them with Vacation Bible school material, yet they organize weekly summer camps to reach the youth with the knowledge of Jesus Christ. The pandemic throughout Europe curtailed attendance, but from the Carpathian Mountains to the Dneiper River, Gospelink preachers donned masks and perseverance this year!

Pavel Petrovich Metlenko, Gospelink's National Director in Ukraine, contracted COVID-19 in November of 2020 and passed away with pneumonia complications. His departure was not anticipated;

he was aging but still serving fervently. Nonetheless Pavel Petrovich leaves a testimony of a faithful God. He was a man concerned about God's reputation and the purity of the bride of Christ. Despite his meager living allowances in his Soviet industrial city, he never filled out an application for personal support from Gospelink. Even though he was evangelizing a small village himself, he always knew of, and recommended, a preacher more needy than himself. Pavel Petrovich then directed Gospelink to find and assist national preachers in Ivano-Frankovsk, Karkhov, and Dneper! The work he started continues!



One pastor calls five people from his church daily to inquire about them and pray for them.

The hearts of the widows, poor, handicapped, jobless, sick and elderly people were very much gladdened by the gifts of cash deposited and groceries distributed. This was the love of God in action.”




